## *Our Focus for the Year ... and why Faith Formation?*

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**The Religious Faith Formation theme for 2018-2019 is “Embracing Change...”** Our aim to continue fostering this vision at FPC through our programs as we welcome changes that will further open us to transformational choices that broaden our UU faith formation by embracing the future..., now.

We are on the first year of a three-year cycle of Identity, Community, and Interconnected World. This year we will explore the definition of our UU Identity now and in the future, as we celebrate the transformation of the renovations of the church to become even more accessible. Ultimately as part of the UU Faith Formation we want our youth to identify themselves as ethical, spiritual, worthy individuals and know they are beloved members of our UU family community and confidently go out in the world and live out their UU Faith. We Believe it begins at home with our families, and here, FPC our communities’ home.

It is through having a strong sense of belonging and feeling loved we show our youth how to maintain their individual UU identities and also have empathy, compassion and love for our community, our earth and everything in our world. Ultimately as part of the UU Faith Formation we want our youth to identify themselves as ethical UU’s by upholding UU morals & principles and spiritual awareness in knowing their worth and confidently say, “I am a Unitarian Universalist” and I belong to a wonderful church family community.

Faith indeed has many faces and as Unitarian Universalist we tend to go beyond the denotation of a word to its many connotations. However for our purposes the definition of the word *faith* is dependent on its partnership with formation: Formation, as a UU religious foundation.

**Religious Faith Formation** provides us a foundation we can use our whole lives, like the joy in our sense of being beloved members of this community. It also provides us with the ability to cope when we get so desperate we think stress is the new normal. Without religion it’s difficult to fill the voids in our world. If we lack the religious faith formation that provides us with **faith in our UU religion...** we doubt the gift of hope, that inner compass, which lets us know we are going to be all right in this journey. Even if we are not sure how it may be, a well thought out process... or a divine mystery.

**Religion** responds to that calmer inner voice that can give us peace, when outside voices muddle our thinking and emotions, calling us to war with ourselves and others. Faith Formation is not meant to give answers, but offers the key. It opens our youth to question, to discern, to empathize, to understand, to love and have compassion for others while maintaining their own identity and self-worth. This is how they know that revelation is not sealed and it’s up to each of us to reveal the life affirming mysteries of love.

We are asking that all youth from Pre-K through High School are here by **9:50am** so they get settled before they start. The older groups 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> will start at 10:00am and end at 11:15am in the chapel;
  - 7<sup>th</sup> grade and older in the High School Room upstairs. This room is open from 10am until 4:30pm with various activities throughout the day. (except COA days)  
Pre-k through 1st will meet upstairs until 11:00am; these groups meet in the same rooms on the days groups meet.
  - *We ask parents/guardians to **sign in Pre-K to 3<sup>rd</sup>** and wait until they are dismissed. Everyone is invited to enjoy Social Hour from 11:00-11:30 and enjoy fellowship with other congregants for coffee, juice, snacks & conversation.*

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### ***Brief Program Overview:***

#### ***"Embracing Change"***

**Very Exciting!** As FPC the renovations to the building get completed we will be even welcoming! "RE" Faith Formation program is embracing this change and further transforming into Lifespan Religious Faith Formation. We are making sure we are doing our best to provide our UU community now, in the future and beyond with the tools needed to strive. The focus is *being* a Unitarian Universalist from multiple perspectives. Approximately once a month there will be UU Faith Formation Chapel Days and an Intergenerational service with a variety of UU themes along with other events. In addition, we will have UU Faith Formation Groups based on grade or age. The groups begin with younger youth learning UU Basics. 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> will be interacting and experiencing UU through spiritual practices and playing games. Our High School youth beginning with 7<sup>th</sup> grade will continue the Sunday morning sessions starting at 10:00am and have various activities choices throughout the day until 4:30pm. COA is offered this year, 2018-2019 to FPC families. Due to the specialized requirements of COA and OWL to families and volunteers they are offered on alternate years. \*

## Share the Value of Attending Regularly, at Least Three Times a Month

It is bonding with other UU's that forms and informs our UU identities.

When two children meet one Sunday, and don't see their new friend and old friends the next, they are disheartened and discouraged about coming back.

No matter how "exciting" or "fun" we make "RE", it's the youth being here that matters...

In EDUCATING FAMILIES that are new to the church on how to be involved in a religious community, it is important to stress the benefits of attending services regularly. Lifers reveal a common thread of regular attendance over the years in their survey responses. Average individual attendance was four times per month during childhood years. For lifers...the routines established early in life proved important in sustaining her lifetime commitment...

We offer support for a life-enriching, lifelong journey that involves the whole family through the calamities and joys of life. We need to welcome and encourage our members to partake of the community at least three times a month in order to reap the full benefits of religious community. (Excerpt from the book: Full Circle; 15 Ways to Grow Lifelong UU's)

*RE Faith Formation is beyond Sunday Mornings, we welcome you to join us in any or every event, regardless if its Sunday Morning or Evening or any day of the week taking a walk in the labyrinth, coming to dinner on Tuesday night... Just come, come, whoever you are... You are Welcome here to be part of our family!*

### ➤ **Sunday Morning...**

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***We strongly encourage regular attendance in our Sunday morning program.** We realize that there are occasions when families are unable to attend, but please attend as consistently as possible. Our children and youth feel greater ease, participate more readily and can build deeper community when they attend regularly. Community Building is one of the foundational stones of our religion and an important part of our Unitarian Universalist Family Identity.*

- **Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten This program is offered to ages 3 to 6. We recommend that children begin here if they are 3 years old in September, and toilet trained. Otherwise, they are welcome to visit the nursery. They will meet in the "Early Beginners Room" upstairs every Sunday.**
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*Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten students will meet together and enjoy activities reinforcing church is a wonderful and safe place to be. Children will play and learn through ritual, songs, stories, games and activities. In this room, there is emphasis on routine to create a familiar place to learn and be together at church. Resources for them will primarily come from "Friendship Finders," written by Roberta Altamari and the UUA Tapestry of Faith Chalice Children: "Early childhood is filled with curiosity and wonder. In a group setting, with loving adult guides, young children can engage in spiritual seeking, develop their openness to sharing, and experience the benefit of a supportive community. Their time in Chalice Children can set a pattern for the rest of their lives and bring lasting benefits" -UUA-Tapestry of Faith.*

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### ➤ **UU Faith Formation Groups: 1<sup>st</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup>**

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All of the groups will provide familiar surrounding promoting security, stability and creating an environment more conducive to their Faith Formation. It also creates an atmosphere of camaraderie that will hopefully develop into long lasting UU friendships. Our early beginner curriculum will incorporate components of OWL for younger children that promotes empowerment through self-awareness and self-respect. Families will be updated weekly. Also, "RE" Express family circular is sent out every month with related themes to activities for the month.

We try to maintain the same leaders every time the groups meet. The leaders are committed to being present, To provide an environment that promotes the creation of our youths Unitarian Universalist identity through their ethical, spiritual UU Religious Faith Formation by promoting their confidence, and knowing that they are worthy and beloved members of our church community and beyond. The agenda will include ethical and spiritual components. Including worship time, reflective times and UU activities that are age appropriate. We will also provide a snack. ***1<sup>st</sup> through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade UU RE Faith Formation Group:***

Our primary grades provide our youth a solid grounding in Unitarian Universalist.

***3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade UU RE Faith Formation Group:***

This group will develop a further understanding of Unitarian Universalism through History and comparing and contrasting it by exploring diverse worldview perspectives **mainly through games**. This group will engage in a variety of activities continuing to build on their UU knowledge and reinforcing what they know through drama, crafts, cooking, games, video, service projects, and ritual. For these grades we will be incorporating special events like field trips and in-house social action projects and earth friendly environmental projects with a focus on community.

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➤ ***High School Youth Group: 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> graders (COA years only)***

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They participate in a program tailored to their interests and needs as Unitarian Universalist High School youth. The youth are empowered and encouraged to express themselves freely and further develop their UU identities by branching out into other components of the Youth Ministry *without any pressures*. The High School Facilitators strive to provide a consistent spiritual sanctuary where our youth can count on us being there for them.

***Youth Space:*** ( Only days that there are no COA sessions in the afternoon)

***Sunday's between 10:00 to 4:30pm in High School Room (subject to change)***

10am to 11am **Welcome & Games:** meets in the High School Room and classmates and friends

11am to 2pm **Free Zone:** Youth can do various activities set up or "just hang out"

2pm to 3pm **Zen Zone:** Quiet Reflective time

3pm to 4:30: **Future and Beyond...**Missions, and Visions Projects Planning Time.

The RECoA in collaboration with the Director of Religious Faith Formation and Youth Programs will be coordinating all events and activities.

There is food provided and youth can also bring in any favorite snacks and drinks.

The space provides a common space for youth to interact with other UU youth and share ideas and plan common goals. It is meant to be an independent and interactive setting to develop lifelong friendships and strong sense of self.

## ➤ Youth Programs Offered at First Parish besides Sunday Mornings

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### ✚ ***Coming of Age (COA) Program-Part 1; Part 2 – 2018-2019\****

#### ✚ ***Bridging Program:***

This program is offered to Senior's. We offer a reflective mini-retreat towards the end of the year. The Bridging program offers a place for youth to reflect upon what it has been like to grow up Unitarian Universalist as well as learn about what opportunities are available to them after graduation. They explore campus ministry opportunities and local and national young adult programs. At the end of the year, seniors prepare speeches and take part in the First Parish Bridging ceremony in June which honors their transition from youth to young adults within Unitarian Universalism.

#### ✚ ***Our Whole Lives (OWL) –7<sup>th</sup> through 9<sup>th</sup> grade***

***Offered again in 2019-2020 There is an OWL facilitator team and groups vary from 6 to 12 participants.*** UUA describes Our Whole Lives program as comprehensive education curricula for use in both secular settings and faith communities. Honest, accurate information about sexuality changes in lives. It dismantles stereotypes and assumptions, builds self-acceptance and self-esteem, fosters healthy relationships, improves decision making, and has the potential to save lives.

#### ✚ ***UU School of Rock!***

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For the foreseeable future due to the demands of the OWL program and the COA-Part 2 program for volunteers, space and other reasons we will be alternating these programs every year. We are happy to accommodate next seniors so they can participate in the COA program this year and next.

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## ➤ 2018-2019 Coming of Age (COA)

The Coming of Age Program (COA) is an important rite of passage for our youth. Because of its importance we are opting to extend it to two parts in order to offer a more balanced and complete program that is inclusive of new societal realities. An additional benefit of a two-part COA program is that we are also going to fully cover all the components recommended by the UUA Coming of Age program. As part of a Religious Faith Formation community we are dedicated to this transformational transition in the lives of our children into loving young adults by providing them with the best coming of age program possible.

***COA- Part 1-2017-18 is incorporated in the High School Group Morning Sessions.*** On these days the emphasis will be for our youth to know Unitarian Universalist in a broader sense. We are *strongly encouraging* the attendance of youth who will be participating in COA-Part 2 in the second year. The goal is for our youth to know Unitarian Universalism and be able to articulate what it is to be a Unitarian Universalist and develop a strong sense of community. These days will include outings for example like the UUA-UU Boston Walk that will help them understand the importance of Unitarians & Universalist, before and after they became one religion and going on a fieldtrip to buy gifts for the Concord Prison Project. We will also have guest speakers specifically talking about subjects pertaining to our UU Identity. We strongly encourage the attendance of youth who will be participating in COA-Part 2.

***COA Part 2-2018-2019:*** The focus will be the more traditional FPC inner reflective exploration of what it means as individuals to be a Unitarian Universalist.

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### ✚ ***UUSoR is an in-house Rock Band that plays during Services, special events, and Talent Show.***

*Youth ages 12<sup>th</sup> to 18 are welcome! All type of musical talents is welcome from beginners to professionals. Band Director will assist new members to acquire the skills necessary to Rock n Roll!!

➤ ***Community Worship: UU Faith Formation Chapel Days & Intergenerational's***

These are held approximately once a month. Community worship offers the opportunity to engage in worship and deepen their understanding of themselves and Unitarian Universalism as a religion and encourage intergenerational friendships. Chapel Days are mainly for our younger groups, however on occasions the High School Group is invited. Chapel days are meant for them to develop a greater understanding of worship and spirituality. The youth will explore themes about spirituality and ethics through stories and spiritual practices. There will be theme based activities of interest for them to explore and a strong emphasis will be placed on encouraging socializing and developing lifelong UU friendships.

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➤ ***Milestones Ceremony:***

At First Parish, we give milestones gifts to honor and encourage the growth of their Faith Formation in our First Parish Unitarian Universalist congregation. Children in Kindergarten, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades are honored with a gift that reflects their spiritual development. Sixth graders participate in a mini-retreat. UU Faith Formation Milestone is celebrated in May or June.

## ➤ Safe Child Policy and CORI for RE Volunteers:

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In order for our students and congregation to flourish it is important that all of us want to make sure that we offer them the safest environment possible. That is why we are very pleased that the Religious Faith Formation Ministry and Standing Committee on April 2013 approved the implementation of the CORI Policy for all RE Volunteers starting in 2013-2014. Along with the Safe Child Policy we will be asking that all religious Faith Formation Program Volunteers to fill out the form at the beginning of the year (CORI forms every two years.) Also, on June 2018 revisions to all the Safety Policies have been made including National Background Check for "RE" Faith Formation Volunteers. If you have not filled out the forms already for this year, they will be available at the RE table during the Social Hour.

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"Virtues" are attitudes, dispositions, or character traits that enable us to be and to act in ways that develop this potential. They enable us to pursue the ideals we have adopted. Honesty, courage, compassion, generosity, fidelity, integrity, fairness, self-control, and prudence are all examples of virtues...

How does a person develop virtues? Virtues are developed through learning and through practice...

Virtues are habits. That is, once they are acquired, they become characteristic of a person...

At the heart of the virtue approach to ethics is the idea of "community". A person's character traits are not developed in isolation, but within and by the communities to which he or she belongs, including family, church, school, and other private and public associations.

As people grow and mature, their personalities are deeply affected by the values that their communities prize, by the personality traits that their communities encourage, and by the role models that their communities put forth for imitation through traditional stories, fiction, movies, television, and so on. The virtue approach urges us to pay attention to the contours of our communities and the habits of character they encourage and instill.

The moral life, then, is not simply a matter of following moral rules and of learning to apply them to specific situations. The moral life is also a matter of trying to determine the kind of people we should be and of attending to the development of character within our communities and ourselves.

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## ➤ Allergies:

**Remember Allergies are a shared responsibility by everyone. Please read following information & requests:** Make sure to write and update allergies on registration sheets and UUFF Group Room Binders sheet. On Sunday mornings we provide organic popcorn and fruits or other healthy snack, High school class is snack is "Munchkins". Youth can bring in a small portioned alternative snack for themselves too. Also on occasions we have events that foods will be provided or we ask the families to bring food. If you do bring food, please include options that everyone can enjoy and/or label food ingredients clearly. Make your child is aware that allergies are a shared responsibility. Teach them to immediately inform an adult if they are have medication or intend to or have if they are having a reaction. Leaders and adults immediately inform: Director of Religious Faith Formation (DRE&FF) Dolores GHeredia-Wood

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➤ **Nursery & Pre-K Class room drop-off and pick-up:**

Drop-off for our Nursery and Pre K class begins at 15 minutes prior to the church service at 10:00 am. We ask that parents let their Nursery/Pre K caregiver know that their child is ready to attend and the care and responsibility for the child will be shifted to the nursery care giver.

**Please note: Nursery sign-in is required.** If there are more than 8 children in the nursery an extra adult volunteer must stay to assist with the children. If a parent arrives with children and there are already 8 children in the room, that parent will be asked to stay in the nursery with their child until an extra qualified nursery volunteer can be found. Do not leave your child in the room unless there is an two FPC Certified Nursery Caregivers or a qualified volunteer or staff member. If there are not two adults, please stay until we can find a volunteer.

The nursery caregiver staff is certified by the Red Cross in Pediatrics First Aid, CPR and have been through Red Cross Child Care Training. Some of our nursery staff has further qualifications.
